Genre Analysis Report

In the genre analysis of my final paper, I looked at the phrases that appeared in the reference of a figure. Of the 19 sentences referring figures, the most commonly used phrase was "as shown in" and "are shown in." They are appeared in six sentences. Also, the verb "show" was used seven times. Next, at beginning and end of the sentence, the single preposition "in" was used four times. The verb "presented" was used four times, too. The sentence "See Figure ~" was used three times. Thirteen sentences referenced figure at the end of sentence (e.g., We assume ~ as shown in Figure 1.) The other verb "get" was used at once.

I discovered "as shown in" was used twice in the same paragraph. So, I changed one side to "as presented in," and I moved the phrase into the beginning of the sentence.

I found that one of the figures is the photograph of the kaleidoscope. Thus, I changed "as shown in Figure" to "as displayed in Figure."

I changed one of the "as shown in Figure" to "As we can see in Figure" and moved it into the beginning of the sentence.

I found that one of the figures is an illustration. So I changed the verb of reference "presented" to "illustrated."
